# Living-dining dilemma? Try a simple swap.

# THE CHALLENGE

Brad Heller and Derek Haberzettl bought a split-level home in Springfield last July but haven't had time to decorate it. They want to tackle the living and dining area but are on a tight budget. They need help with furniture placement and choosing art and colors.

## THE SOLUTION

Designer Susan Jamieson swaps the living and dining areas to create a more functional and intimate space. She uses a room divider (not shown) to establish an entry space and updates existing furniture with paint.

# JAMIESON'S SUGGESTIONS

Warm up the two spaces with similar grays: Benjamin Moore's <u>Balboa Mist</u> in the dining area and <u>Cumulus Cloud</u> in the living room. Save money by enhancing existing furniture. Add colorful pillows and art, and paint the living room cabinet (not shown in rendering) <u>Lakeside Cabin</u> by Benjamin Moore. Don't be afraid to put furniture in front of a window. Arranging artwork next to the window creates needed balance. Mix finishes such as linen, black iron, chrome and natural wood to create warmth and interest. Using the smaller space as the living room adds coziness and still allows for flow of movement between the rooms.
